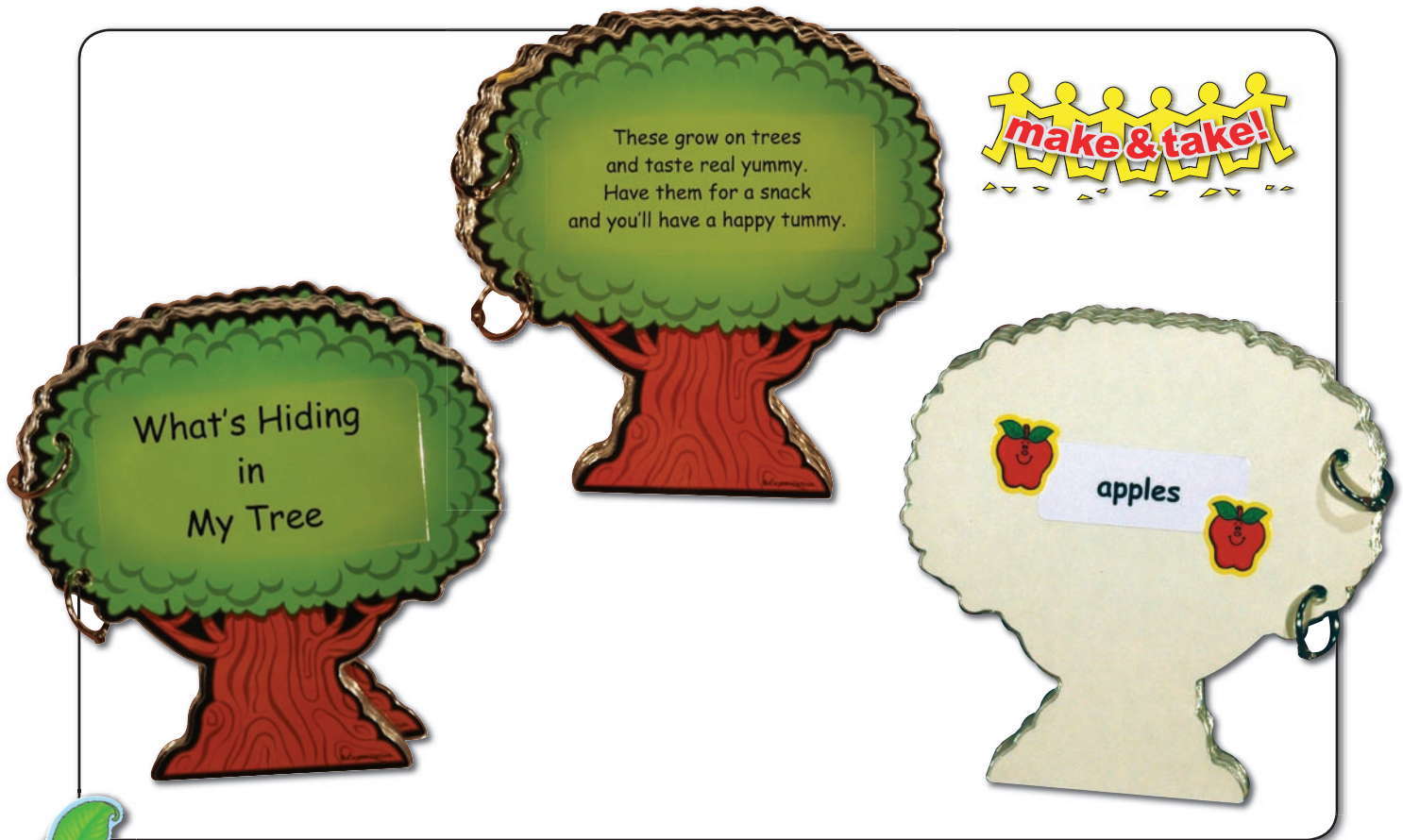


# What's Hiding in My Tree?



## Items used to make this Project:

- CD-6912 Trees Colorful Cut-Outs (Single Design)
- Carson-Dellosa Shape Stickers:
  - CD-5280 Turtles: Kid-Drawn
  - CD-5265 Pumpkins
  - CD-5252 Fish
  - CD-5273 Stars: Kid-Drawn
  - CD-5279 Turkeys
  - CD-5253 Flowers: Kid-Drawn
  - CD-5244 Bees
  - CD-5255 Frogs
  - CD-5242 Apples
  - CD-5251 Fall Leaves: Kid-Drawn
- Jingles, questions, and instructions (see below)
- Clear mailing labels (2" x 4" size) for jingles, questions, and instructions
- White address labels (1" x 2" size) for answers
- Loose leaf book rings (1" size)

**Directions:** Copy jingles, answers, questions, and instructions onto appropriate labels. Attach title label to front of first tree and instruction label to back. On each tree, attach jingle to front and answer (sticker and word) to back of tree. Use one sticker for singular word and multiple stickers for plural words. On the last tree, attach questions label and one of each sticker. Laminate all trees, punch holes, and attach with loose leaf book rings.

### Now that you know what is in my tree; can you guess the answer for each of these:

How many are animals?  
 How many can you eat?  
 How many can you touch?  
 Read the jingle and guess what's hiding behind the tree.  
 Turn the page and see if you are right!

**Jingles:** My home is my shell, it's quite a cozy place.  
 Round and hard, it protects me if I want to hide my face.

Their color is orange, their shape is round.  
 In a patch is where they can be found.
